## CREAMERY PRETEND PLAY




## MATERIALS:

- Small table or toy kitchen
- Ice cream treats (real or fake)
- Cups, cones, spoons, toppings
- Cash register or calculator + money pouch


## WAYS TO PLAY:

- Scoop ice cream (pom poms, play dough, kinetic sand) into cones or cups
- Use with ice cream tinker tray
- Create a price menu
- Design an ice cream shop sign
- Practice counting coins
- Take turns being the customer + shop owner


## MATERIALS:

- Cardboard cones or cups
- Play dough or Kinetic Sand
- Scoop or spoon
- Pom poms, cut-up paper straws and other small household/crafts items


## WAYS TO PLAY:

- Create ice cream treats with play dough/kinetic sand + decorate with loose parts
- Scoop into cones or cups
- Use cups or cones to mold dough/sand
- Ice cream shop dramatic play
- Give ice cream creations silly names


## COOL TREATS

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## SNOW CONE SENSORY BIN



## MATERIALS:

- Sensory table or large plastic bin
- Ice cubes (blended in blender)
- Food coloring + flavoring
- Squirt bottles
- Scoops
- Cups or paper cones
[Optional] sprinkles, marshmallow topping


## WAYS TO PLAY:

- Scoop, pour, squirt
- Observe color mixing + ice melting
- Taste-test new flavor combos
- Sensory play
- Snow cone truck dramatic play

MIXED-MEDIA GELATIS


## MATERIALS:

- Shaving cream
- White glue
- Food coloring
- Paper cup (cut in half)
- Construction paper
[Optionall Pom poms, sprinkles, paper straws, spoons, paint sticks, glitter, washi tape, markers


## WAYS TO CREATE:

- Decorate the cup with markers, washi tape or paint sticks
- Add glitter, foam balls, sprinkles, pom poms, straw or spoon
- Paint with brush or fingers
- Experiment with color mixing

## MATERIALS:

- Large bowl
- Blender (+ adult supervision)
- Ice cream
- Milk
\{Optional\} M\&ms, oreos, chocolate syrup, frozen fruit, ice cream toppings


## WAYS TO PLAY:

- Pour, scoop, stir, blend
- Make ice cream in a bag to use in shake
- Do the magic M\&M and milk experiment + add to milkshake
- Observe color mixing, changing state of matter, heterogeneous + homogeneous mixtures


## MATERIALS:

- Sprinkles
- Name puzzle, tracing board or tray [Optional] Popsicle sticks, paper cones, tweezers, small scoop


## WAYS TO PLAY:

- Use a name puzzle, tracing board or the alphabet printable from this packet
- Fill a tray with sprinkles and draw letters in the sprinkles with finger or popsicle stick
- Transfer sprinkles with fingers, ice cream scoop. shaker bottle or cone

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## ICE CREAM STENCILS



## MATERIALS:

- Tissue Box
- Strip of paper (6x18)
- Paint
- Old credit/store card
- Construction paper or cardboard
- Glue or glue dots
[Optional] Pom poms, acrylic gems, glitter, sprinkles, beads


## DIRECTIONS:

- Collapse a tissue box [See directions on the next pagel
- Use a plastic card to smear paint through the tissue box opening and onto the paper to make the scoops.
- Repeat to make 3/4 scoops
- Add toppings
- Glue a triangle for the cone.


Add tiny sticker gems, glue sprinkles, glitter or draw toppings with marker

Try a triangle cut from corrugated cardboard. Peel the top layer to create a cool texture

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## COOL TREATS

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## SNACKTIVITIES

- DIY healthy freeze pops or popsicles
- Build your own ice cream cookie sandwiches and roll in sprinkles
- Make ice cream in a bag
- Freeze a yogurt with a popsicle stick in the top for a homemade healthy yogurt pop
- Ice cream sundae or banana split bar
- Dip a banana in yogurt, peanut butter or chocolate and freeze on a popsicle stick
- Do a blindfolded ice cream taste test


## OTHER ACTIVITIES:

- Make popsicles from paint swatches and popsicle sticks
- Make sidewalk chalk popsicles
- Use Do A Dot markers to paint ice cream scoops on top of a construction paper cone
- Personalize your own nylon freeze pop holder
- Buy an ice cream from an ice cream shop or truck
- Use ice cubes on popsicle sticks to paint abstract paintings
- Play in a sensory bin of frozen cotton balls + ice cream scoop
- Draw a giant ice cream cone + have little ones decorate with sticker "toppings"
- Make ice cream play dough with frosting
- Scoop Floam into cups like "Dippin Dots" ice cream
